He helped build the boar test station, was a board member for many years, served as president for 1 year and as secretary for 4 years. He started a cemetery fund for both Fairview and Tates Chapel and served on both boards for many years. He was a member of the Farm Bureau for 52 years, was the county Vice President for 7 years, served as President for 7 years and served as Secretary of Treasury for 4 years. He was a stockholder of Public Gin for years and as treasurer for 8 years.
