“ *The Life and Times of Gary Cooper Brown (1947-2024)
The Man, The Myth, The Legend!*

Gary Brown is truly a legend to our family, my daughters and my granddaughters, and I have always told them stories of our storied history together.

Me and my brother Johnny Lee 1st met Gary Brown in 1963, 61 years ago! We bought our place on Weiss Lake and Gary lived just across the cotton fields from us, less than a quarter mile and within shouting distance, which we did often! Gary always lived life wide open, whether it was on his old Ford tractor, or in his 14' runabout boat with a 35 Johnson outboard motor, or in his Dodge 383 Charger.

Our first encounter with Gary was in 1963 when he came to bush hog our land. Immediately we knew he was quite the character as he cleared the ground with his mower. Nothing was an obstacle to Gary on that bush hog and he went at it full speed. He came back often to keep it cut as we cleaned up behind him. That tractor often stood on the back 2 wheels as he went along cutting. He cleaned all of the lots on the lake in our area and me and Johnny often went with him hanging on to the tractor for dear life.

Gary taught many of us kids how to water ski and he was a pro and knew exactly how to teach us. He taught me and my brother and when he taught me I got up the very first time I tried. That's how good he was! He taught our neighbors Diane and Paulette Wester, Lynn Keener and all the Mackey clan and the Anderson's and all who came to Hopewell Advent Christian Church. That was our gathering place and the lake was also.

He taught us how to ski on 2 and then how to drop one off and then how to get up on one. He taught us how to ski off the pier and how to come in for a safe landing right on the bank and just step out of your ski onto dry land!

That boat of his would go very fast and that's how he drove it. He would pull one or two skiers and a couple of times three of us. He would turn his boat so sharp to the left that he could drink water

from the palm of his hand and if you were in the boat with him you would be straight up in the air looking down at him and holding on for dear life. There never were boat races on Weiss Lake because everybody knew Gary would be the automatic winner.

Me and my brother rode around with Gary Brown in his souped up Dodge with overhead cam which I have never known what it was but it must have been important because Gary said it was. Fast and furious originated with Gary in that car and if my parents knew how fast that car would go we never would have been in it.

Gary had a lot of knowledge about a lot of things. He went to school to learn how to be a boat mechanic and he worked on everyone's boat, especially ours. Even in recent history he came to our house to work on our boats. We had some boats that just pattered about and Gary came to the rescue. My daughter bought her own boat and it was pretty much a lemon and Gary came to work on it. Once, we worked all day long on that boat and it would not crank and then we finally called Gary Brown to the rescue again. We were all standing around the boat and Gary arrived and I promise you he got into the boat and turned the switch and it started right up. That's the truth and this just added to his legendary status in my family.

Me and Johnny often went with Gary to work in the corn fields and again we were holding on for dear life and we gathered lots of corn that day.

One winter the lake froze over in front of our house and Gary came over with a flat bottom boat and me and my brother got in the boat with him and we had a 3 pronged anchor that we threw out in the ice and pulled ourselves all the way across our slough. In front of Gary's house was a big pond and it was frozen over and my favorite brother Johnny fell through it and Gary Brown rescued him. We went to Gary's house and got around the old pot belly stove and dried my brother out. I don't think we told our parents about that.

Me and Johnny have visited with Gary over the last few months and now I wish we had visited more often. We talked about all these old times we shared together. I always prayed with him before we left

and he was so appreciative. As we left we told each other that we loved one another. My brother talked to him on the phone just last week as Gary was in the hospital and Gary's last words to my brother were, "I love you!"

So long ole friend and thanks for all the wonderful adventures you shared with us! See you on the other side! 🙏🙏🙏
