Mr. George Harold Jordan, age 86 of Centre, passed away Friday, February 7th at Redmond Regional Medical Center.

George, also known as "Fishhook", was active in the community serving on several local boards and was known to all as a magician and trickster; He was also a veteran of the U.S. Army during World War II; He was the son of the late George Hoyt and Ethel Mae Brock Jordan
