Gregory Dion Jelks, 55 of Australia, formerly of Cherokee County, passed away Friday, January 6th in Australia.

Gregory Dion Jelks was born August 16th, 1961 to the union of Frank and Mary Jelks. He was the baby boy and was welcomed by three siblings: Tyron, Vernon, and Patrick. Ten years later they were all joined by a sister named Fonda. He got away with everything and was even able to drive at the age of eight.

He was a boy scout from age of eight thru sixteen and went on to become an eagle scout. He attended Cherokee County High School and graduated in 1980. Later he attended Gadsden State Community College. He played basketball that led to a scholarship in baseball where he went to the minor leagues in Kansas in 1981 and to the majors in 1987. He was inducted into the hall of fame in 2005 in Cherokee County.

He came to know Christ at an early age thru the fellowship of Christian leaders. While everyone else would follow the rules, Greg did everything he could to break them.
