Rev. Dr. Sammy M. Stabler, age 94 of Centre went home to Jesus on Saturday March 21st 2015. Celebration of his life will be 7 PM Wednesday March 25th at Perry Funeral Home Chapel with his grandsons, Rev. Mark Adams, Rev. Don Woolley and Mr. David Stabler officiating. He lived his life based on the following statement that he used so often “I would rather see a sermon than hear one any day”. He loved the Lord with all his heart; he loved the United Methodist Church and he loved his family. He has fought the fight and has won the battle.

Rev. Dr. Stabler was also very involved in the communities he served by being members of the Civitan Club, Rotary Club, and Lions Club as well as being a Mason and Shriner.
